

The Town has not developed a significant municipal aquaculture program. Except for the seed donated by Taylor sporadically to the Town, there is no public propagation program. Fairhaven has supported the transfer of some shellfish from contaminated waters to clean bays where the contaminants are filtered out in a relatively short timeframe and can then propagate for future harvesting.

Environmental Technology

There has been a great deal of interest in Massachusetts on the potential for creating new jobs through the development of the environmental technology industry. The interest in Fairhaven arises from the large number of individuals and organizations involved in environmental issues and the activities at the University of Massachusetts. While there is considerable interest in this industry, it is important to be realistic about the current state of the industry and its employment potential for Fairhaven residents.

Industry Definition

The environmental technology industry is large and diverse in terms of the products and technologies offered and markets served. The defining characteristic of such technology is *that which serves to protect, repair, or enhance the environment.*

It helps to see that the environmental technology industry is organized along several defining axes. *The first organizing characteristic is whether firms are manufacturing a product or providing a service.* About two-thirds of all environmental technology firms define themselves as environmental service providers. The remaining third either manufacture products for consumer markets or industry, or distribute equipment. Service firms provide analysis and testing, engineering, and waste management. Manufacturing firms make pollution control equipment, such as smokestack scrubbers, instruments for detecting leaks, and biological agents to remove toxic substances.

The second defining characteristic is the environmental media that they serve -- air, water, and solid waste. Each medium involves different scientific and technical fields of study for understanding how different media work. For instance, firms that specialize in air pollution place a greater technical emphasis upon atmospheric sciences than do firms in solid waste and water markets, which require more understanding of geology.

The third characteristic relates to the waste stream itself, which has a beginning, middle, and end. Firms target their goods and services to different points along this waste stream. Most firms address the middle or end of the waste stream. Firms specializing in the end of the waste stream technologies address hazardous waste containment, clean up, and remediation needs. Firms addressing the middle of the waste stream are working to help companies reduce toxic effluents resulting from the manufacturing process. Examples include smokestack scrubbers or recycling. Increasingly, more and more firms are addressing the front end of the pollution

stream by substituting less toxic materials into the production process, or by changing processes to promote greater efficiency and reduce toxic byproducts.

The final organizing characteristic is that of markets, private and public. The markets for environmental technology are quite diverse. Customers in private industry include: utility power plants; industrial power plants; manufacturers of chemical, metal, and agricultural products; paper and allied products; and petroleum and coal producers. Public clients include: federal government, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Department of Energy (DOE), the Department of Defense (DOD), state agencies, and municipal agencies.

Overview of National Trends in the Environmental Technology Industry

With regard to the nature of overall trends, industry analysts indicate the following:

- *The growth in the industry, predicted in the early 1990s, has not materialized due to the recession, easing regulatory laws, and alternative means of complying with regulations.*

In the late 1980s, analysts were predicting that the global environmental market would boom. Since Massachusetts had a considerable concentration of firms in the industry, the expectation was that the state would see considerable job growth and business development in this industry. While the international industry is still expected to grow (from about \$200 billion in 1990 to \$300 billion in the year 2000), the rate of growth will not be as great as anticipated. Moreover, as global competition in the industry increases, the market share of U.S. companies is likely to decrease. According to the Environmental Business Council, there are about 1,600 companies in Massachusetts that either develop, provide, or make environmental and energy products and services. These companies employ about 55,000 people. While the industry was growing at a 20 percent rate in the early part of the decade, growth is now stagnant. Recent analyses talk of the "consolidation, downsizing, and maturation of the industry."

- *A declining commitment from the federal government for technology development support in the industry could further constrain the industry's development, particularly in Massachusetts where firms have benefited from existing programs.*

Congressional budget cuts are likely to significantly decrease or eliminated federal programs that have supported the development of emerging environmental technologies. Most notably, the Clinton Administration's Environmental Technology Initiative, or ETI, is being threatened. New England companies have won a disproportionate share of these funds (12 percent last year) and, thus, will be hurt by the program's reduction. In addition, Congress is considering many measures that will ease environmental regulations, thus affecting overall demand for environmental technologies.

- ***The emphasis of industry goods and services is moving up the waste stream, i.e., from toxic cleanup and waste disposal to pollution prevention and waste minimization.***

Such a move is occurring for two basic reasons. First, federal and state governments are encouraging such an approach through regulation and voluntary efforts. Second, the private sector is increasingly moving from tactical compliance of regulation to strategic environmental management, creating value through avoided costs and improved corporate image, as well as in process and resource efficiency. In addition, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission now requires corporations to list environmental liabilities on corporate balance sheets.

- ***Strategic environmental management requires effective technology.***
 - Since the 1970s, the focus of the environmental industry has been on solving existing environmental problems, be they waste disposal, engineering, technical, regulatory, or legal. Transition to strategic environmental management requires longer-term solutions, moving from fewer isolated technical fixes to more turnkey project management. Thus, longer-term environmental solutions will be increasingly based on technology rather than services, particularly in pollution prevention and on-site treatment.
- ***At the same time, there are a significant number of difficult and complex cleanup jobs that need attention over the next several decades.***
 - For example, there are 60,000 EPA superfund sites, 2,400 Resource Conservation and Recovery Act sites, 22,000 state sites, 7,200 DOD sites, and 100 DOE sites nationwide. DOE alone will spend more than \$130 billion over the next 30 years to conduct its environmental management and waste minimization mission. The cleanup required at the Massachusetts Military Reservation is one example of this type of cleanup.
- ***Exports are a major revenue source and business opportunity for U.S. environmental technology firms.***
 - EBI estimates that exports comprised 10 percent of industry revenues in 1993. Export opportunities are growing in light of significant interest in both the developed and developing world (including Eastern Europe) in pollution prevention and cleanup. Equipment and service providers from other nations, including Germany and the United Kingdom, are battling for market share as well. Currently, U.S. firms have a 40 percent share of the world market.

Overview of Regional Activity in the Environmental Technology Industry

- ***The region does not currently have a significant number of firms involved in environmental technology.***

While there is a great deal of interest in promoting more activity in the environmental technology industry, currently there are few companies in the New Bedford region involved in the industry.

- ***The mining of the landfill in Fairhaven has provided the Town with some visibility, particularly amongst those in the solid waste industry.***

Faced with a landfill that was quickly reaching its limit, the Town of Fairhaven embarked on an innovative project that has involved the mining of its landfill. The Town contracted with Biosafe International of Cambridge to excavate the landfill and remove any salvageable materials. As a result, the Town expects to create enough space for 12 more years worth of garbage. This project is one of only eight reclamation projects in the nation. However, industry experts predict thousands of such efforts developing in the next few years.

- ***The region does have a number of organizations and individuals who are very active in the environmental movement and interested in developing "green industry" and promoting sustainable development.***

Throughout the Buzzards Bay region are individuals and organizations with a strong commitment to the environment. The region has recognized the importance of its natural resources and is beginning to make a commitment to ensuring that the environment remains a positive asset of the region. There is also a strong interest in finding innovative solutions to environmental problems that enhance the regional economy. Through pursuing "sustainable development," the potential exists for identifying potential opportunities such as the development of an "eco-industrial park" that houses a diverse set of companies in the environmental industry or that utilizes innovative technologies to conserve energy and minimize potential pollution. In fact, the New Bedford region was cited by the President's Council on Sustainable Development as an area that has some potential for the further development of the concept of sustainable development.

Tourism

- ***The Fairhaven/New Bedford area has traditionally been a brief stop for tourists on their way to the Cape and Islands.***

The tourism industry in the New Bedford and Fairhaven area is anchored by the region's whaling and port-related history. Visitors typically come to the area for a one-day visit or on their

way to Cape Cod and the Islands. Attractions include museums, historical houses, factory outlets, and restaurants.

The principal attractions include the New Bedford Whaling Museum, the Roth-Jones-Duff House and Garden Museum, the New Bedford Historic District, the New Bedford Visitors Center (which includes the Lightship New Bedford and the Schooner Ernestina), Buttonwood Park and Zoo, Zeiterion Theater, the Manjiro Nakahama Exhibit, Fort Phoenix, and the waterfronts of each community.

Walking tours that highlight the area's historical and architectural treasures include: the North Baptist Church, the Almy House, the Russell House, and the Waterfront Historic District in New Bedford; and the Slocum memorial, the Millicent Library, Town Hall, and the Huttleston House in Fairhaven.

The region also features a number of seasonal events and activities sponsored by the New Bedford Office of Tourism, the Whaling Museum, the Buttonwood Park and Museum, the Portuguese community, and the Fairhaven Tourism Committee. These include the New Bedford Waterfront Arts Festival, the Portuguese Feast, the Whaling City Festival, and the Fairhaven Annual Homecoming Day Fair.

- ***If the proposed initiatives succeed, the New Bedford area has the potential to be a destination site.***

While the Fairhaven/New Bedford area has traditionally been a brief stop for tourists on their way to the Cape and Islands, it may soon be a destination if the proposed initiatives succeed. If the Wampanoag casino is developed along with the proposed hotels and restaurants, and if the aquarium, clean-up of the Harbor, improved ferry service, and development projects from the recent "Charette" come to fruition, the region could very well become a significant tourist destination in the state. These new initiatives would add considerable value to the existing attractions and could result in tens of thousands of people eventually coming to the region.

- ***Fairhaven's position as a tourist attraction must be seen in the larger context of the greater New Bedford region.***

Fairhaven does not have the kind of anchor attraction or the tourism infrastructure to be seen as a destination. The Fairhaven Tourism Committee has done an exceptional job of packaging and promoting existing tourism resources, and the Committee realizes that the Town's ability to draw visitors depends on maintaining and protecting these resources, as well as developing a close working partnership with New Bedford.

- ***Fairhaven's strengths currently rest with its historic past, its architectural richness, the Fort, the beach, and potentially the waterfront. Its challenges with respect to tourism include: capitalizing on the waterfront; improving its accommodations; developing staff capacity; and formalizing its current volunteer tourism committee.***

If improvements to the waterfront's aesthetic and physical infrastructure can be made to


make the area more visually attractive and user-friendly, the Town could significantly enhance its existing resources of history, architecture, and recreation. The benefits of improving the waterfront are noted above. The recent opening of the Hampton Inn clearly helps build a stronger base of accommodations, but more could be done particularly with respect to B&Bs and the Seaport Inn in order to enhance the foundation of lodging facilities. The Town also needs to make more of an investment in its capacity to become a more solid player in the regional tourism industry.

- ***Regional tourism coordination in the region could be stronger if the area wishes to capitalize on the initiatives currently being proposed.***

Several tourism officials in the region indicated that tens of thousands of visitors could be coming to the region if the casino and other initiatives are successful. This will require a significant amount of coordination, cooperation, and logistical support to effectively handle the increased tourist flow into the region. Informal relationships have been built among some of the region's tourist businesses and organizations, but these should become more formalized and overseen by the current industry leadership.





Town of Fairhaven Per Capita and Median Household Income





Town of Fairhaven Educational Attainment











Total Employment Fairhaven 1984-1993







Total Employment New Bedford LMA 1984-1993






Agriculture Construction Manufacturing Wholesale and Retail Trade Services Government







Fairhaven 1984-1993






New Bedford Massachusetts U.S.













Fairhaven 1984-1993





Fairhaven, New Bedford LMA, Massachusetts, U.S.



Fairhaven, New Bedford LMA, Massachusetts 1984-1993




